For more than five decades pianist Morris Nanton performed in clubs, lounges, and restaurants throughout his native New Jersey.

For twenty-two of those years, the Morris Nanton Trio held forth at the Cove in Roselle, where I had the pleasure of hearing them frequently during the mid 1970s. In recent years they appeared regularly at Shanghai Blue in Madison, and Nanton often played solo piano at the Quay in Sea Bright, where he gave his final performance on September 27, 2009, one day before his eightieth birthday. On November 15, Morris Nanton died at his home in Perth Amboy.



Sheryl Bailey: A New Promise (MCG Jazz): Until now, guitarist Sheryl Bailey has recorded

exclusively in a combo format, so her new release, backed by Pittsburgh's Three Rivers Jazz Orchestra, is both a refreshing change and a real breakthrough. A gifted, accomplished improvisor, Bailey enlivens two standards, presents three fine originals, and fondly interprets three compositions by the late guitarist Emily Remler, to whom this CD is dedicated. <u>The Diva Jazz Trio</u>: *Never Never Land* (<u>Arbors Records</u>): The rhythm section of the Diva Jazz

Orchestra — drummer Sherrie Maricle, pianist Tomoko Ohno, and bassist Noriko Ueda – stands on its own as a cohesive jazz trio. The many highlights of their debut CD include Ueda's clean, strong tone on "I've Grown Accustomed to Her Face," Maricle's intense, varied rhythms on "Love for "Sale," and Ohno's relentless, two-handed swing on "If I Only Had a Brain." Flip Philip & Ed Partyka Dectet: Hair of the Dog (ATS Records): This ten-member, Vienna-

based ensemble performs the exciting, edgy compositions of its co-leaders, Austrian vibraphonist Flip Philipp and American-expatriate bass trombonist Ed Partyka. Their music may not be for "everyone" — but it's for anyone who enjoys being challenged and stimulated by the minds and souls of creative writers and bold improvisors. Rufus Reid: Out Front (Motema): One of the most respected bassists of our time, Rufus Reid

thrives in this brilliant trio showcase. Reid's compositions — notably the monumental "Glory" and "Caress the Thought," an extended jazz suite for three instruments — are impressive, and his virtuoso rendering of Tadd Dameron's "If You Could See Me Now" is spellbinding. 
